
Kodiak ADA Improvements: Rezanof Drive Segment 5 State Project No. SFHW00433 Federal No. 0011050

The Proposed Project

- ► The DOT&PF is proposing to provide a continuous accessible route along the north side of Rezanof Drive between Marine Way and Benny Benson Drive, a 2mile-long corridor in the City of Kodiak.
- Currently, this stretch of Rezanof Drive includes narrow sidewalk widths, excessive cross slopes, and numerous curb ramps not compliant with standards required in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).


Construction

Construction is anticipated to commence in phases starting in 2026 and continuing in 2027 and potentially 2028. The project would likely occur in two or three stages.



Preliminary Schedule

- Currently working on the environmental document
- Stage 1 anticipated construction start: Spring 2026
- Stage 2 anticipated construction start: Spring 2027



ADA Improvements

▶ ADA improvements would be made to sidewalks, curb ramps, driveways, and street crossings of Kodiak Segment 5 of the Southcoast ADA audit, approximately 1.9 miles of Rezanof Drive, between mile point (MP) 1.905 to 3.877.





Proposed Project Activities

The DOT&PF is proposing the following project activities on Rezanof Drive, Marine Way to Benny Benson Drive:

- Reconstruct curb ramps as necessary to meet current ADA standards
- Widen sidewalks to a consistent minimum width
- Reconstruct driveways where sidewalk is too steep
- ▶ Relocate school zone beacon reducing sidewalk width
- Relocate electrical load center at Middle School to remove restriction of sidewalk width
- Install a pedestrian beacon at the Kodiak Y to improve pedestrian crossings of Rezanof Drive



Proposed Project Activities (Cont.)

- ► Replace failed culverts that are causing damage to sidewalk
- ► Remove vegetation restricting usable sidewalk width
- Reconstruct existing retaining walls as necessary that are damaged or are reducing usable sidewalk width
- Relocate light poles to provide wider sidewalks and increase buffer from pedestrians
- Adjust electrical junction boxes that have become a tripping hazard
- Reconstruct ditches that are draining onto sidewalks and creating icing in winter/ponding in summer
- Install drainage structures and pipes to intercept storm water to prevent icing at curb ramps



Right-of-Way (ROW)





- ▶DOT&PF does everything it can to reduce the impacts of transportation improvements on private property. Occasionally, additional rights are needed to build highways and sidewalks to current safety standards.

- By receiving public feedback during project development, the design team can take a proactive approach to the engineering, engaging them for collaborative solutions.


